9th USPE European Police Championship Volleyball Men 26.05. – 01.06.2013 in Frankfort on the Main/Germany

Invitation to Enter

The German Police Sport Federation DPSK (Deutsches Polzeisportkuratorium) was entrusted by the Union Sportive des Polices d'Europe (USPE) with the organization of the 9th USPE European Police Championship Volleyball Men from 26th of May – 1st of June 2013 in Frankfort on the Main/Germany.

The following invitation to enter is issued for the Final Round of the USPE EPC Volleyball Men 2013.

Transport will be provided from the Frankfurt on the Main airport/train station by the host.

Delegations which need a VISA are requested to contact the host in time.

6. Referees

The USPE Competition Rules No. 2.4 shall apply:

In basketball and volleyball each country qualified for the final round **must** provide an international referee. In case of non-compliance the respective country shall be sanctioned with a fine in the amount of 250,00 Euros payable to the organiser for financing a substitute referee.

The organizer will provide more referees if needed.

7. Classification

Qualification for the Final Round

Directly qualified:

Germany (Organizer), Bulgaria (3rd EPC 2009) and Netherlands (5th EPC 2009) are directly qualified.

Qualification for the Final Round:

The Preliminary Round will be played from 01st of September 2012 until 01st of February 2013.

The 1st of each preliminary Group and the best 2nd team compared of all Groups are qualified for the Final Round.

The draw for the Final Round will take place at the headquarter of the German Volleyball Federation in Frankfurt on the Main on April 10th 2013.

8. Timetable

The provisional timetable is enclosed to the Invitation to Enter

9. Competition rules

The organizer has to ensure that a medical first aid will be present at every match. The organizer also has to make sure to meet the safety requirements.

The USPE Competition Rules, item 4.4, shall apply.

4.4 Volleyball

4.4.1 The rules and regulations laid down by the FIVB apply, unless otherwise stipulated below or provided for in the invitation to enter.

4.4.2 The EPC shall comprise preliminaries and a final round.

Preparation and organisation of the preliminary rounds depend on the number of engaged teams. Subject to rule 1.3.1, at least six teams take part in the final round. The number of participating teams is set by the TC and is guided among other things to the total number of enrolled teams. The team of the organising member union is qualified directly.

For the preliminary round, every team will be able to engage a maximum of 12 players and up to three attendants.

For the final round, every team will be able to engage a maximum of 12 players and up to four attendants.

The list of the players is closed during the technical meeting. No changes will be allowed after the technical meeting.

In agreement with the Secretary General, the responsible member of TC decides

The Technical Commission shall determine the organisational framework of the preliminaries and the rules and regulations applicable to the final round eighteen months before the organisation of this last one.

The preliminaries should be concluded no later than four months prior to the start of the final round.

4.4.3 In the event of level scores regarding both the preliminaries and the main event, the final rankings shall be determined in accordance with Art. 4.7 of the "Senior European Championships Regulations" laid down by the CEV.

All appeals have to be made in writing by the delegate or one of the attendants of the member union in question within less than an hour after the end of the fixing of or the publication of the results unless the respective international rules specify different.

The protest must be written in one of the three official languages of the USPE.
The protest fee will be a total of 100,00 EUR, paid in cash.

11. Eligibility to start

Article 23 Statutes: The Competitors

(1) Participation in Championships is restricted to athletes who:

1. meet the starting requirements of their International Union,
2. belong to a National sport's organisation that is a member of USPE,
3. are police officers or
4. are police students at a public Police Academy,
5. have reached the age of 18 years at the of the Championship
6. and have signed the Anti-Doping Declaration.
7. and submit the USPE Declaration of Participation signed by the respective President/Secretary General to the competent member of the Technical Commission.

Article R 12/2 of the Rules and Regulations: Competitors

(1) In order to be able to take part in an European championship organised by the USPE, the members of the member unions have to fulfil the following conditions:

1. They have to satisfy the provisions set out in Article 23 of the Statutes.
2. They have to be police officers or students at a public police academy. The police are a set of all bodies and institutions in charge of maintenance of public law and order (administrative police and crime investigation departments).

(2) Military police, members of the military, members of the fire brigades and civil servants that do not belong to the police are excluded from European police championships.

Sub-paragraph 1.5 of the Competition Rules

Sportsmen and sportswomen having participated in military championships are not eligible to enter European police championship for 12 months following these military championships.

Sub-paragraph 1.8 of the Competition Rules

Competitors suspended from sports contests by the respective sports association due to having violated the relevant doping regulations are not eligible to enter.

Sub-paragraph 1.9 of the Competition Rules

All teams shall wear uniform sportswear displaying the emblems of their individual member union.

The provisions laid down in the Statutes, the Rules and Regulations, the Competition Rules as well as the Anti-Doping Regulations of the USPE shall apply.

12. Verification of eligibility to enter

For verifying a contestant's eligibility to start, the production of his/her police ID, his/her passport/personal identity card as well the signed Anti-Doping-Declaration will be required.

All participating countries have to present the USPE Declaration of Participation for each athlete who will participate, signed by the respective President or Secretary General.

Without this declaration it is not possible to participate!

The verification will be effected by the representative of the Technical Commission.

13. Anti Doping

Doping tests (urine or blood) will be conducted during the championship, with the current WADA list of prohibited substances being applicable. (www.wada-ama.org).

Every competitor must sign the USPE Anti-Doping-Declaration and hand it over to the USPE Technical Delegate at the accreditation.

14. Expenses/fees

14.1 Travelling expenses

Each member union will defray its own travelling expenses.

14.2 Board and lodging

Delegate

The expenses incurred by the delegate (Article R 11 of the Rules and Regulations) of the respective member union will be paid by the organizer.

Team

For all participants/attendants 40,00 EUR per person per night are to be paid to the organizer (Article R 14/3 of the Rules and Regulations).

Guests

Should a member union intend to take guests with them and should the organiser be able to provide the respective accommodation, each guest shall pay the actual costs incurred by them and charged by the organizer.

Anti-Doping Declaration

I, **First Name** _____ **Name** _____, herewith confirm that I know and acknowledge the USPE Anti-Doping Regulations and the WADA World Anti-Doping Code.

Doping constitutes a violation of the USPE Anti-Doping Regulations.

Violations of Anti-Doping Regulations are:

1. The presence of prohibited substances, its metabolites or markers in the athlete's bodily specimen.
 - It is each athlete's personal duty to ensure that no prohibited substances enter his or her body. Athletes are responsible for any prohibited substance or its metabolites or markers found to be present in their bodily specimens. Accordingly, it is not necessary that intent or negligence on the athlete's part be demonstrated in order to establish an anti-doping violation.
 - The presence of any quantity of a prohibited substance or its metabolites or markers in an athlete's sample shall constitute an anti-doping rule violation, excepting those substances for which a quantitative reporting threshold is specifically identified in the WADA "List of Prohibited Substances and Methods".
 - As an exception to the general rule, the „WADA List of Prohibited Substances and Methods“ may establish special criteria for the evaluation of prohibited substances that can also be produced by the body itself (endogenously).
2. Use or attempted use of a prohibited substance or a prohibited method.
 - The success or failure of the use of a prohibited substance or prohibited method is not material. It is sufficient that the prohibited substance or the prohibited method was used or attempted to be used for an anti-doping rule violation to be committed.
 - Refusing, or failing without compelling justification, to submit to sample collection after notification as authorised in the USPE regulations or any other anti-doping regulations, or otherwise attempting to willingly evade sample collection.
 - Tampering or attempting to tamper with any part of doping control.
3. Possession of prohibited substances and prohibited methods.
 - Possession by an athlete
Possession by an athlete at any time or place of substances that are prohibited in out-of-competition testing in accordance with the WADA Prohibited List or the use of prohibited methods by an athlete, unless the athlete establishes that the possession is pursuant to a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) granted or other acceptable justification.
 - Possession by athlete support personnel
Possession by athlete support personnel of substances that are prohibited in out-of-competition testing in accordance with the WADA Prohibited List or the use of prohibited methods by athlete support personnel (in particular doctors, trainers/coaches, attendants and support staff) in connection with an athlete, competition or training, unless the athlete support personnel establishes that the possession is pursuant to a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) granted to the athlete or other acceptable justification.
4. Trafficking in any prohibited substance or prohibited method.
5. Administration or attempted administration of prohibited substances or prohibited methods to any athlete or assisting, encouraging, aiding, abetting, covering up or any other type of complicity involving an anti-doping violation or any attempted violation of the anti-doping regulations.
6. Participation or attempted participation in European Police Championships during a period of suspension or ineligibility imposed by the USPE or any other international or national sports federations.

The undersigned accepts full personal responsibility for compliance with the above set of rules. He/she accepts that any violation of these regulations will give rise to sanctions, in particular with regard to cost of proceedings and the respective measures governed by the applicable national provisions of the member countries.
