<u>Drug Tests (Doping) during USPE European Police</u> <u>Championships</u>

Responsibilities of the participating Country

In accordance with the World Anti-Doping Code and for the purpose of protecting the health of the male and female athletes, USPE joined in the fight against doping.

All member countries, all officials of the USPE as well all members of the delegations participating in USPE competitions shall be obliged to ensure implementation of the World Anti-Doping Code and to support the rulings passed by the disciplinary bodies.

The USPE Anti-Doping declaration states, that everyone participating in USPE Competitions has to sign, is stated, that the respective person knows and acknowledges the USPE Anti-Doping Regulations, the WADA World Anti-Doping Code, the International Standard for Testing and Investigation, the International Standard for TUE, the International Standard - Prohibited List and the International Standard for the Protection of Privacy.

Everyone is responsible for herself/himself to know, follow and respect the rules.

If a competitor takes prohibited substances or use prohibited methods mentioned in the WADA Prohibited list to treat an illness or condition, a Therapeutic Use Excemption (TUE) to participate is needed.

Who doesn't comply with these regulations/standards is not able to take part at the EPC or is violating the WADA Code and the USPE Anti-Doping Regulations.
