

## USPE European Police Championship Accreditation Form

To make the accreditation smooth and easy, the teams should fill in this form before they meet for the accreditation. Please fill in all the required information:

- No – (in team sports the athletes are supposed to take the same number on the shirt in all matches)
  - Name – family name and first name
  - Date of birth – day / month / year
  - Police ID no
  - Passport no – or a national ID with a photo
  - Anti-Doping Declaration – the form shall be signed by the participants at the accreditation
  - Declaration of participation – signed by the respective President or Secretary General
- The athletes must bring all the required documents listed above.
  - Everyone (delegate, attendants and athletes) must bring the Anti-Doping Declaration.
  - According to the European General Data Protection Regulation every participant must sign an agreement to use their personal data and photographs/videos taken during the EPC (this is in responsibility of the participating Member Country)

As a reminder of who can participate in EPC, important regulations are listed below:

### The USPE Statues (Article 23 – The competitors):

Participation in Championships is restricted to athletes who:

1. meet the starting requirements of their International Union,
2. belong to a National sport's organisation that is a member of USPE,
3. actually provide police service at the time of the championship  
or
4. are police students at a public Police Academy,
5. have reached the age of 18 years at the of the Championship
6. and have signed the Anti-Doping Declaration.
7. and submit the USPE Declaration of Participation signed by the respective President/Secretary General to the competent member of the Technical Commission.

### USPE Competition Rules paragraph 1.3.2:

Competitors suspended from sports contests by the USPE or by the respective sports association due to having violated the relevant doping regulations are not eligible to enter.
